NEXT REGULAR MEETING – FEBRUARY 9, 2023

Osawatomie, Kansas. **January 12, 2023.** The Council Meeting was held at Memorial Hall located at 411 11th Street. Mayor Nick Hampson called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Council members present were: Macek, Diehm, Dickinson, LaDuex, Bratton, Filipin and Caldwell. City Staff present at the meeting were City Manager Mike Scanlon, Deputy City Manager Bret Glendening, City Clerk Tammy Seamands, City Attorney Jeff Deane, Assistant to the City Manager Sam Moon, Director of Utilities Terry Upshaw, Public Works Director Michele Silsbee and Business Liaison Kari Bradley. Members of the public were: John Wastlund and Kevin Schasteen.

INVOCATION. – John Wastlund, The Well Wesleyan Church

CONSENT AGENDA. Approval of January 12th Agenda, December 23rd Council Meeting Minutes, Pay Application – Western Consultants - \$3,388.50 – WWTP, Pay Application – BG Consultants - \$81,224.00 – Water Treatment Plant Improvements, Pay Application – BG Consultants - \$79,235.48 – Water Distribution Improvements, Pay Application BG Consultants - \$7,552.50- WWTP, Pay Application - BG Consultants - \$50,953.50 – Various Street Designs. **Motion** made by Dickinson, seconded by Diehm to approve the consent agenda as presented. Yeas: All.

COMMENTS FROM THE PUBLIC. – The Well Wesleyan Church is working with Grief Comforts. They are using the facilities to offer grief counseling and a support group so that people know that they are not alone. This is a Christian based and is available on Tuesdays from 6:30 p.m. – 8:30 p.m. at the church.

PRESENTATIONS, PROCLAMATIONS AND APPOINTMENTS. – None.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS.

RESOLUTION 1088 – AUTHORIZATION TO SIGN COST SHARE AGREEMENT WITH KDOT– The city approved Resolution 973 on February 17, 2022 which directed city staff to apply for cost share funds to offset the cost of construction for 6th Street from the northern limits of the city (roughly Lincoln Ave.) to the southern limits of the city (roughly Kelly Ave.). The city applied unsuccessfully in the Spring of 2022 but reapplied in the Fall and was successful in being awarded \$1,500,000 to aid in the costs of reconstructing the main thoroughfare.

The current cost estimate for the 6th Street project is \$3.9 million dollars. With this \$1.5M grant and the city’s portion of the county sales tax for roads and bridges in the amount of \$500,000, the city’s portion will be \$1.9M which will come from the proceeds of the bonds issued in March of 2022. Keep in mind that the city has committed \$1,734,521 for the 18th Street, Main Street Terrace and Walnut Ave. which are currently under contract. Furthermore, the current cost estimate for Brown Avenue from 7th to 12th is \$2.5M and remaining proceeds from the bond issue are slightly more than \$4.1M. All this being said, the costs of construction are based on the engineer’s estimates which have historically been higher than where bids have come in and we will continue to look for ways to reduce the costs of construction. Council should be aware that

we may need to go to the bond market for additional funds and there is not going to be a lot of room in the budget to add amenities like decorative street lights, new traffic signals, etc. **Motion** made by LaDuex, seconded by Caldwell to approve Resolution 1088 – Authorizing the mayor to sign the 2023 cost share agreement with the Kansas Department of Transportation as presented. Yeas: All.

RESOLUTION 1090 – ACCEPTING BID FROM TANTALUS FOR AMI SYSTEM – City staff requested proposals for the replacement of all electric meters, water meters, and an AMI system to collect data from those meters. This is to replace the current system that was installed in 2006. The city currently has approximately 2003 electric meters and 1638 water meters. A new AMI system will provide more data such as alerts for high daily usage, tampering, outage reports, power restore, and real time reads. Data will be more accurate. All meters would be read from City Hall instead of our current drive by system. It will also have the capabilities of remotely disconnecting electric meters for non-payment or customer requested disconnection. This will free up staff in the distribution fields to focus on other job tasks. All water and electric meters would be replaced, which should potentially allow the city to capture more accurate reads and reduce our water and electric losses. With more data and real time reads it will also potentially identify water leaks on customer side sooner which will save customers money. **Motion** made by LaDuex, seconded by Filipin to approve Resolution 1090 – Authorizing the purchase of AMI metering system and awarding the bid to Wesco (Tantalus) as presented. Yeas: All.

NEW BUSINESS.

RESOLUTION 1089 – AUTHORIZING PURCHASE OF BUCKET TRUCK– The electric distribution currently has two bucket trucks, 2005 Altec on a Freightliner chassis, and 2008 Versa-lift on a Ford 650 chassis. Altec currently performs all maintenance and repairs on these trucks. Staff was informed by Altec that they will no longer be able to service or repair the 2008 Versa-lift because they have a policy that they do not work on other manufacturers equipment that is 15-years or older. For this reason, staff wants to replace the 2008 Versa-lift truck. City staff budgeted \$230,000 for the purchase of a bucket truck for electric distribution. Staff has been informed that new trucks from Altec if ordered today would not be available until 2027 and the cost currently ranges from \$285,000 to \$325,000, depending on features. Staff has vendors looking for a used truck that meets our requirements. If a truck becomes available it typically is sold within 5-10 days. For this reason, staff is asking Council to approve the purchase of a truck not to exceed the amount of \$230,000.

Staff has located a 2014 Altec truck on an international chassis that will be available later this month. Staff intends on inspecting this vehicle once it is made available to determine its condition. Cost of this truck is \$120,000. Staff also has been in contact with Altec to determine the trade in value of the 2008 versa-lift and Altec has offered \$20,000 for it. **Motion** made by Caldwell, seconded by LaDuex to approve Resolution 1089 – Authorizing the purchase of a used bucket truck for the electric department not to exceed the amount of \$230,000 as presented. Yeas: All

RESOLUTION 1091 – ESTABLISHING PROCESS AND CALENDAR FOR FILLING VACANT TERM OF CITY COUNCILMEMBER – Per city code within forty (40) days of the mayor informing the Council of a vacancy, the nominating committee shall recommend

candidate(s) to the Council, Individual Council members may also recommend candidates to fill such vacancy. **Motion** made by LaDuex, seconded by Caldwell to approve Resolution 1091 – Setting the calendar for the selection of candidate to fill the unexpired term of councilmember Kirk Wright as presented. Yeas: All.

RESOLUTION 1092 – APPROVING ENGINEERING AGREEMENT WITH BG CONSULTANT FOR JOHN BROWN AND LEVEE LOOP TRAIL PROJECT– As a community we have five primary goals. Two of those goals are creating economic development and investing and maintaining soft infrastructure. This contract and the resulting construction of the South Levee and John Brown Loops will help in achieving those goals. Additionally, this is a project that a majority of the funding is coming from a \$1.5 million dollar Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) Transportation Alternative (TA) grant. **Motion** made by Dickinson, seconded by Bratton to approve Resolution 1092–Authorizing an engineering contract with BG Consultants, Inc. for the design of South Levee and John Brown Loops as presented. Yeas: All.

RESOLUTION 1093 – DIRECTING STAFF TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION FOR THE EXPANDED PSP GRANT FOR THE FLINT HILLS TO KATY CONNECTION – City staff is asking the City Council to consider applying for a Planning Sustainable Places (PSP) study that would have three supporters on the application splitting \$20,000 of the local government match (\$5,000 per entity). These are “left-over” funds that KDOT and MARC are taking applications for. This application period ends January 27, 2023. I’ve included the information provided us so far from MARC. **Motion** made by LaDuex, seconded by Filipin to approve Resolution 1093 – Directing the city manager to apply for a planning sustainable places (PSP) grant for the planning necessary to create the Flint Hills Trail to Katy Trail connection as presented. Yeas: All.

RESOLUTION 1095 – DECLARING OSAWATOMIE PRIDE A CONTINUING CHAPTER OF KANSAS PRIDE PROGRAM– **Motion** made by Caldwell, seconded by Filipin to approve Resolution 1095 – Declaring that Osawatomie as an official entrant in the Pride Program as presented. Yeas: All.

EXECUTIVE SESSION – **Motion** made by Lawrence, seconded by LaDuex to recess into closed, executive session for the purpose of discussing of company recruitment pursuant to the financial affairs or trade secrets of corporations, partnerships, trusts and individual proprietorships exception in K.S.A. 75-4319 (b)(4). The closed meeting will last 10 minutes and will resume here in Memorial Hall at 7:23 p.m. Also attending will be City Manager Mike Scanlon, Deputy City Manager Bret Glendening, City Clerk Tammy Seamands, City Attorney Jeff Deane and Business Liaison Kari Bradley. Yeas: All.

Dale Bratton ~ The police department served another successful warrant. I hope they keep up the good work.

MAYOR'S REPORT – Something that I want to highlight tonight is our Water Services group. When Terry took over as our Director of Utilities, we had just one Class 3 License at the Wastewater Plant and no certified operators at the Water Plant– and we were in violation of KDHE regulations. In just short 18 months we've gone from 1 licensed operator to 7. With four people holding Class 2 licenses, one person having a Class 3 license and two people with a Class 4 licenses. None of that would have happened without Terry Upshaw --- I think that deserves a round of applause – Thank you Terry.

I want to thank Bret for finishing up the Northland Service Agreement with MICO Water District #1 – we've been trying to get that done for decades and Bret's persistent paid off. We've got a signed agreement BRET GOTTER DUN!!!



ORDINANCE NO. 3822

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER IX OF THE OSAWATOMIE MUNICIPAL CODE TO LIMIT FEES CHARGED BY COURT APPOINTED ATTORNEYS IN THE CITY OF OSAWATOMIE, KANSAS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF OSAWATOMIE, KANSAS:

SECTION ONE: The Code of the City of Osawatome, Chapter IX. Municipal Court is hereby amended to add Article 9-112 which shall read as follows:

“9-112. Court Appointed Attorneys; Limitations on Fees.

(a) For attorneys appointed to represent indigent defendants charged in the Municipal Court of Osawatome, Kansas, as adults, the City shall pay fees at the rate of eighty-five (\$85) dollars per hour.

(b) Notwithstanding the provisions of Subsection (a) above, the maximum fee to be paid an appointed attorney for any one indigent representation shall be eight hundred fifty (\$850) dollars.

(c) Upon completion of representation of an indigent defendant in the Osawatome Municipal Court, the appointed attorney shall present claim for payment to the City Clerk.

(d) For services rendered to an indigent defendant for appeal and trial in the District Court of Miami County, Kansas, the fees to be paid to the attorney representing the indigent defendant shall be as set out in Sections 1 and 2 hereof.”

SECTION FOUR: Any ordinance or part(s) of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION FIVE: This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its publication in the official city newspaper.

On January 24, 2008, the city council adopted Ordinance 3636 which capped court appointed attorneys to a rate of \$50/hr. or \$500 in total if the case went to trial. While the city had at some point entered into a contractual relationship with Geri Hartley to be retained on a monthly stipend to provide these services, this cap has not been updated and is now grossly behind what surrounding municipal and district courts are paying attorneys to take on indigent defense.

Ordinance 3822 increases the hourly rate to \$85 and the cap for trials at \$850. It also codifies the rates in Chapter IX Municipal Court.

RE: Authorization to enter into mutual aid agreement through the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC)

RECOMMENDATION: That the City Council approve resolution 1098

DETAILS:

The City of Osawatomie currently (to the best of our knowledge) has entered into two previous mutual aid agreements. One (authorized under Resolution 552) is through KMEA and is strictly for lending support to other municipal electric utilities during qualifying events.

The second mutual aid agreement is through the Kansas Mutual Aid Program (supported by FEMA) and was authorized under Resolution 654 and is also for qualifying events, but encompasses all utilities and other possible needs. Both of these mutual aid agreements applied to intrastate aid only.

This mutual aid agreement provides for interstate aid and is authorized under [KSA 12-16,117](#) (link included). This statute states that any governing body of any municipality may establish a policy by adoption of an ordinance OR resolution. As this effort is being put forth by MARC, there is a possibility that we could be asked to provide assistance if we are able to do so, to Missouri members of MARC, and as with all mutual aid agreements, providing assistance to any signatory to the agreement is not binding.

Upon adoption, this agreement will need to be filed with Miami County’s Emergency Management Coordinator.

RESOLUTION NO. 1098

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PARTICIPATION IN THE REGIONAL RESOURCE SHARING AGREEMENT THROUGH THE MID-AMERICA REGIONAL COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the Regional Resource Sharing Agreement through MARC will be in addition to the City of Osawatomie’s current mutual aid programs established under Resolutions 552 and 654; and

WHEREAS, the Regional Resource Sharing Agreement will strengthen and supplement current mutual aid agreements that the City of Osawatomie is a party to by establishing a basic understanding regarding liability issues and procedures particularly when operating across state lines; and

WHEREAS, the Regional Resource Sharing Agreement provides an understanding of which jurisdictions are willing to participate in a sharing agreement to support the requests of other jurisdictions to meet their needs; and

WHEREAS, the concept of the Regional Resource Sharing Agreement is considered a best practice by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED:

Section 1. The Governing Body of the City of Osawatomie, Kansas, through its constitutional home rule authority and K.S.A. 12-16,117, hereby authorizes the City Manager to enter into the Regional Resource Sharing Agreement through MARC.

Section 2. The Governing Body also directs city staff to provide notice to the Governing Body whenever city resources will be committed to participate in a mutual aid request.

Dear City/County Administrators,

The Mid-America Regional Council and the Regional Homeland Security Coordinating Committee (RHSCC) are pleased to provide the **Kansas City Regional Resource Sharing Agreement (RSA)** for your jurisdiction's use. Designed to strengthen resource sharing across the bistate area, the agreement will help identify cities and counties willing to share resources (including across state lines) prior to an incident, promote unity of effort and expedite mutual aid efforts.

Mutual aid agreements currently exist that cover some separate and discrete response disciplines. However, the region has identified the need for a more in-depth, comprehensive understanding of how certain resources could be shared and assistance offered.

Developed and approved by the RHSCC through extensive work by a multi-disciplinary group of emergency services professionals from across the region, the RSA serves as a "safety net" helping communities to access a wide range of potentially needed resources and achieve economic and logistical efficiencies to support gaps in resources and capability. The agreement will also help ensure that many disciplines, such as public information officers, medical examiners, public health, public works volunteers and others, can be quickly mobilized and deployed.

The RSA is not intended to supersede or replace any existing agreements, but to provide a basic understanding between participating jurisdictions regarding the sharing of resources not covered by other agreements. The RSA assists to clarify the liability issues related to resource sharing. There are some circumstances where resource sharing may not be explicitly or implicitly permitted, such as jurisdictions required to adopt resolutions or ordinances to participate in resource sharing or making formal declarations which may delay response. The implementation of this agreement provides a means to address this issue.

Participation in the RSA is voluntary and is intended to strengthen the current working relationships between jurisdictions within the region. Jurisdictions in the region are encouraged

to participate and become signatories to the agreement. Participants will be asked to sign/execute the document and submit an email with the signature page/ordinance of authorization to JWhite@MARC.org for formal recording of an entities decision to participate.



WHEREAS, the concept of the Regional Resource Sharing Agreement is considered a best practice by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA).

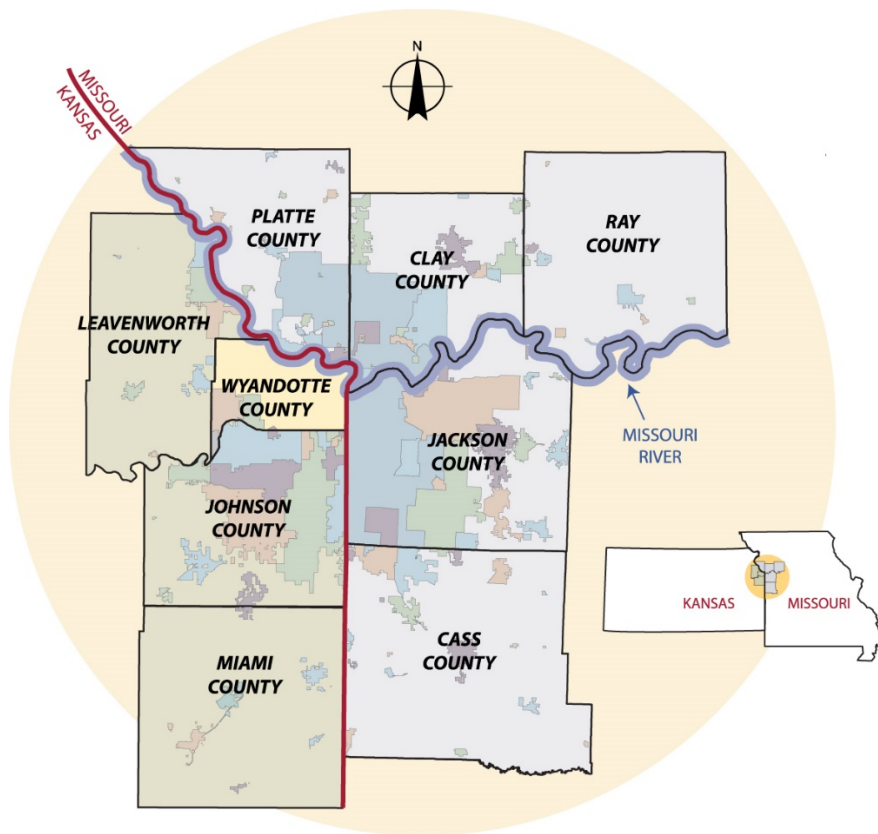

Greater Kansas City Regional Resource Sharing Agreement

Preamble

This agreement is designed to strengthen the local jurisdiction's ability to provide and request assistance quickly and legally, clarify liability, supplement existing agreements, and provide for any gaps related to the specialty Agreements already in place.

Article I: Purpose and Scope

1. **AGREEMENT OF LAST RESORT** – This Agreement is to be used as the agreement of last resort when the sharing of a resource is not covered by any other local written mutual aid agreement. There are already mutual aid agreements and laws in place serving as the foundation for mutual aid for law enforcement, fire, emergency medical services and most regional specialty teams.
2. **NON-OBLIGATORY** – This Agreement does not obligate any party to take an affirmative action or to incur costs to which the jurisdiction is not able to commit at the time of the emergency.
3. **NO PENALTY RESERVATION** – In the event of an emergency or disaster, one or more Assisting Jurisdictions may assist. The offer of assistance by the Assisting Jurisdiction is made with the full understanding that such assistance will not unduly jeopardize the protection of the Assisting Jurisdiction's community. Any decision regarding whether an Assisting Jurisdiction can spare staffing and/or resources shall lie solely with the Assisting Jurisdiction.
4. **COMPREHENSIVE** – This Agreement may be applied to share any resource or asset under the Assisting Jurisdiction's control.
5. **NON-DECLARATIVE** – A federal, state, county, or local disaster declaration is not required for a participating jurisdiction to render assistance to another jurisdiction covered by this Agreement.
6. **INTERJURISDICTIONAL RELATIONSHIPS** — The Regional Resource Sharing Agreement should build on existing interjurisdictional relationships and not supersede existing mutual aid agreements or disrupt normal lines of responsibilities between jurisdictions. Jurisdictions should seek to obtain resources based on normal interjurisdictional

relationships between special districts, townships, cities and counties.

7. NON-EXPIRING – This Agreement shall remain in effect for an indefinite term, subject to a participating jurisdiction’s request to withdraw. Withdrawal from this agreement may occur at any time by written notification to MARC at least 60 days prior to the withdrawal. Upon withdrawal from this Agreement, any equipment provided to the Parties shall be returned to the supplying agency. A Party’s written withdrawal from this Agreement will be deemed a modification by amendment to his Agreement but does not terminate this Agreement as to the remaining Parties. MARC shall maintain a list of which jurisdictions signatories, date and status.

Article II: Benefits

There are important reasons for a regional Resource Sharing Agreement. These advantages include:

- Improves the quality of emergency planning and response through coordinated protocols for notification, response, assistance, and documentation of support,
- Allows for optimal use of the region’s resources, reducing the need to duplicate expensive specialized assets,
- Increases the likelihood that resources will be available and able to be deployed in response to need,
- It provides a mechanism for the use of the Incident Support Team and Emergency Support Functions within local emergency operations centers,
- It provides a mechanism for the use of resources supporting multi-jurisdiction training and exercises,
- A regional resource sharing agreement has the benefits of allowing requesting agencies to seek support from multiple organizations, depending upon the scale and type of incident and the resources needed at a particular time.

Article III: Authorities

A variety of federal and state laws allow for the creation of relationships between governmental entities for jurisdictions to share human and material assets, and services. Some key statutes specifically with regard to emergency situations exist in Kansas statutes 12-16,117 and in Missouri RSMo. § 44.090-.098 and § 70.837.

The jurisdictions represent that the individual executing this Agreement on behalf of the jurisdiction or entity has the authority to bind and agree to the terms contained herein.

This Agreement is made for the sole benefit of the parties hereto and nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to give any rights or benefits to anyone other than the parties hereto.

In general, the basis for this Regional Resource Sharing Agreement is the legal ability for governments, such as Counties, Cities, Villages, Townships and Special Districts, to agree in principle to the possibility of sharing resources when requested by another governmental entity which is also a signatory of this Agreement. Both Kansas and Missouri statutes recognize the

ability of local governments to participate in interlocal agreements such as this Regional Resource Sharing Agreement.

We recommend that Kansas jurisdictions review [KSA 12-16,117](#) and consider adoption of an ordinance regarding the possibility of sharing resources within the region and across state lines. Sample ordinance language is found in Attachment B.

Article IV: Definitions

Assisting Jurisdiction: A political jurisdiction, multi-jurisdictional agency, or other entity providing critical community services agreeing to assist another signatory that is a participating member of the Kansas City Regional Resource Sharing Agreement.

Authorized Representative: The chief executive of a political jurisdiction, to include the Board of Police Commissioners established under Missouri statute RSMo. § 84.350, or multi-jurisdictional agency, or their designee, who is empowered to request resources, obligate resources, and expend funds on behalf of the political jurisdiction or multi-jurisdictional agency under the terms of this Agreement. The designee is often the Emergency Management Director / Coordinator.

Emergency Management Agency: The agency responsible for coordinating emergency management activities through all-phases – mitigation, preparedness, response, and recovery – within a jurisdiction.

Emergency or Disaster: Any situation needing an immediate response for which the community cannot alleviate without outside assistance regardless of formal declarations.

Mutual Aid: A prearranged written agreement and plan whereby assistance is requested and provided between two or more political jurisdiction, to include the Board of Police Commissioners established under Missouri statute RSMo. § 84.350, or multi-jurisdictional agencies during a large-scale emergency or disaster under terms of this agreement. It includes the sharing of people, equipment, consumable items.

Period of Assistance: The period of time beginning with the departure of any personnel and/or equipment of the Assisting Jurisdiction from any point for the purpose of traveling to provide assistance exclusively to the Requesting Jurisdiction, and ending on the return of all of the Assisting Jurisdiction's personnel and equipment to their regular place of work or assignment, or otherwise terminated through written or verbal notice to the authorized representative of the Requesting Jurisdiction by the authorized representative of the Assisting Jurisdiction.

Personnel Licensure Compact: A legal document passed as state legislation in the individual states that wish to become part of that particular interstate agreement. In general, these types of Compacts allow personnel to move over state lines easier during normal day to day operations.

Requesting Jurisdiction: A political jurisdiction, to include the Board of Police Commissioners established under Missouri statute RSMo. § 84.350, or multi-jurisdictional agency that is

responding to a natural, man-made, or technological hazard that has requested assistance from another signatory that is a participating member of the Kansas City Regional Resource Sharing Agreement.

Special District: A local government with a board of directors and taxing authority recognized by the state as a stand-alone entity. Commonly fire districts, ambulance districts, 911 districts, road districts, sewer districts, school districts etc. These local government entities may be signatories of the Regional Resource Sharing Agreement.

Article V: Governance

The signatory to this Agreement is the Authorized Representative or delegate authorized by the County, City, Township, Village or Special District, to facilitate the development of interagency policies and procedures to ensure timely and efficient resource availability in response to and recovery from emergencies or disasters.

This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts, each of which will be deemed an original copy of this Agreement and all of which, when taken together, will be deemed to constitute one and the same Agreement. This Agreement shall be effective upon the execution of counterparts by more than one party. The parties may sign the same counterpart. The parties' signatures transmitted by facsimile or by other electronic means shall be proof of the execution of this Agreement and shall be acceptable in a court of law.

The Regional Resource Sharing Agreement may be amended upon the endorsement of at least two-thirds (2/3) of the member jurisdictions.

The Regional Homeland Security Coordinating Council (RHSCC) and the Policy Committee of the RHSCC shall serve as the lead body regarding the Resource Sharing Agreement. The RHSCC shall be responsible for implementation.

The Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) agrees to serve as the Administrator for this Regional Resource Sharing Agreement, to catalog participants and the use of the Agreement.

Article VI: Recognition of Licensure and Certification

The recognition of licenses and certifications of personnel who are requested to serve in a jurisdiction which is different than where they have a license or certification has been issued, will be able to serve predicated upon a variety of state laws, compacts or other legal agreements. The adoption of laws, interstate licensure compacts and other legal agreements for reciprocity occurs frequently and jurisdictions should evaluate this aspect as needed.

Article VII: Liability Protection and Immunity

1. All activities performed under this Agreement are deemed to be governmental functions including health, welfare, and safety of the general population.
2. For the purposes of liability, all members of any political subdivision or public safety agency responding under operational control of the requesting political subdivision or public safety

agency are deemed employees of such responding political subdivision or public safety agency and are subject to the liability and workers compensation provisions provided to them as employees of their respective political subdivision or public safety agency. Qualified immunity, statutory immunity, sovereign immunity, official immunity, and the public duty rule shall apply to the provisions of this section as interpreted by the federal and state courts of the Assisting Jurisdiction. The parties to this Agreement acknowledge and agree that the Responding Jurisdictions located in Missouri are prohibited by Missouri law from indemnifying other entities, and that notwithstanding any other language in this Agreement, the indemnification provisions in this Section and the reimbursement provisions below shall not require Responding Jurisdictions located in Missouri to indemnify or reimburse the other parties to this Agreement.

3. Any person holding a license, certificate, or other permit issued by a political jurisdiction or multi-jurisdictional agency or the state meeting qualification in a professional, mechanical, or other skill licensed to operate in the Assisting Jurisdiction will be duly recognized by the Requesting Jurisdiction for the duration of their assignment (including long term recovery under an approved recovery plan).
4. No party to this Agreement shall be liable for its failure or refusal to render aid pursuant to this Agreement.

Article VIII: Employment Benefits

All pension, relief, disability, death benefits, workers compensation and other benefits enjoyed by the employees of parties rendering assistance shall extend to the services they perform under this Agreement outside their respective jurisdictions as if those services had been rendered in their own jurisdiction.

Article IX: Deployment

1. Requests for assistance including the provision of people, equipment, consumable items, services, and information may either be verbal or in writing and will be administered through authorized representatives (or their designees) of the political jurisdiction or multi-jurisdictional agencies.
 - a. Verbal requests will be followed up with a written request for assistance within thirty (30) days per the accompanying administrative protocols to this Agreement.
2. The Requesting Jurisdiction and the Assisting Jurisdiction both agree to notify their jurisdiction's local Emergency Manager if requests are made, and if support is offered, as outlined in this Agreement.
3. Each political jurisdiction, to include the Board of Police Commissioners established under Missouri statute RSMo. 84.350, or multi-jurisdictional agency has the latitude to develop their own travel policies for their jurisdiction. As such, travel policies and required documents to process reimbursement under the agreement will vary from political jurisdiction or multi-jurisdictional agency to political jurisdiction or multi-jurisdictional agency. Regardless of the differences in travel policies amongst political jurisdiction or multi-jurisdictional agencies, the accurate collection, preparation, and submission of documentation is important.

Article X: Reimbursement

Reimbursement is outside the scope of this regional intergovernmental agreement. This issue is left between the assisting and impacted jurisdictions to be discussed should the need arise at the time of the incident between the two parties.

Article XI: Termination

1. This Agreement shall be construed to effectuate the purposes stated in Article I herein. If any provision of this Agreement or its application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the invalidity shall not affect any other provision or application of the Agreement which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
2. Nothing herein shall preclude any political jurisdiction, to include the Board of Police Commissioners established under Missouri statute RSMo. § 84.350, or multi-jurisdictional agency from entering into supplementary agreements or affect any other agreements already in force.
3. The Assisting Jurisdiction shall retain the right to withdraw some or all of its resources at any time from the Requesting Jurisdiction. Notice to withdraw shall be communicated to the Requesting Jurisdiction's Authorized Representative or their designee, as soon as practicable.

Article XII: Dispute Resolution

Once resources are deployed, the relationship is established between the entity providing the resource and the entity requesting the resource and it is incumbent upon them to define the relationship and seek to establish clear understanding of the relationship and its obligations and responsibilities.

Should disagreement arise on the interpretation of the provisions of this Agreement, or amendments or revisions thereto, that cannot be resolved at the operating level, the areas(s) of disagreement shall be stated in writing by each party and presented to the other party for consideration.

Article XIII: Operational Plan

This Agreement is written to provide a known process on how to request and receive assistance and the expectations associated with a request.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency's National Response Framework and state laws enable states and their political jurisdiction or multi-jurisdictional agencies to enter into agreements that allow for the timely, efficient, and effective sharing of resources during catastrophic events, even if a formal federal or state disaster declaration have not been declared. The federal government has in recent years encouraged a "Whole Community" approach to emergency management, which seeks to ensure community recovery begins at the earliest possible opportunity without the need to render federal aid.

The National Incident Management System (NIMS) also provides well-established and uniform guidelines for incident management and response.

Where possible commonly accepted forms of written communications should be utilized such as the accepted ICS forms and processes.

Requests for Assistance

Political jurisdiction or multi-jurisdictional agencies party to this agreement agrees to honor any form of written request, as agreed upon through such written agreement and containing the following data elements. No specific request form is prescribed.

1. The intent to implement this agreement, as distinguished from any other existing mutual aid agreement;
2. A general description of the emergency situation, damage or injury sustained or threatened;
3. Identification of the emergency service function or functions for which assistance is needed (e.g. fire, law enforcement, emergency medical, search and rescue, transportation, communications, public works and engineering, building, inspection, planning and information assistance, mass care, fatality management, public information and communication, resource support, health and other medical services, etc.), and the particular type of assistance needed;
4. The amount and type of personnel, equipment, materials, supplies, and/or facilities needed and a reasonable estimate of the period of assistance that each will be needed; and
5. The location or staging area where the resources are to be dispatched and the specific time that the resources are needed; and
6. The name and contact information of a representative of the Requesting Jurisdiction to meet the personnel and equipment of any Assisting Jurisdiction; and
7. The name and contact information of the authorized representative for follow-up questions if needed to fulfill the resource request.
8. Jurisdictions might consider the use of FEMA ICS 213 RR Modified for requesting resources, as well as the process and procedures that commonly accompany the use of the ICS 213 RR.

The authorized representative in the Assisting Jurisdiction will be responsible for forwarding and coordinating the request for assistance with the appropriate emergency support functions and/or organizations within their jurisdiction or agency based on availability of the resources requested.

An authorized representative who determines that their Assisting Jurisdiction has the available personnel, equipment or other resources, shall so notify the authorized representative of the Requesting Jurisdiction and provide the following information, to the extent known:

1. A complete description of the personnel and their expertise and capabilities, equipment, and other resources to be furnished to the Requesting Jurisdiction;
2. The estimate period of assistance that the personnel, equipment, and other resources will be available;
3. The name of the person or persons to be designated as supervisory personnel for the Assisting Jurisdiction; and
4. The estimated time of arrival for the assistance to be provided at the designated location.
5. Any additional information or support needed from the Requesting Jurisdiction.

Appendix B: Sample Kansas Ordinance

NOTE: This agreement is not determinate upon adoption of an ordinance per KS Statute 12-16,177.

KS Statute 12-16,117 permits a local ordinance to be adopted by the jurisdiction to share resources across state lines. Missouri does not require such a statute.

Here is the ordinance from Johnson County, Kansas:

Sec. 26-1. - Mutual aid policy.

- (a) This section is intended to provide assistance in any form of service including, but not limited to, police, fire, emergency medical service, emergency management, public works, as well as administrative and clerical support during times of disaster as defined in K.S.A. 12-16,117.
- (b) In the event of a disaster, when there is a request for assistance from another municipality within or without the state, if the county can provide assistance without unduly jeopardizing the protection of its own community, the county manager, or his or her designee, in coordination with the emergency management division coordinator, is hereby authorized to provide such assistance as may be requested under authority granted by K.S.A. 12-16,117, with all the privileges and immunities provided therein.
- (c) Any assistance offered or provided pursuant hereto shall not be in conflict with:
 - (1) The county emergency operations plan;
 - (2) Other county resolutions or any existing interlocal agreement;
 - (3) Automatic aid;
 - (4) Intergovernmental or mutual aid agreement or the authority to enter into any such future agreements.
- (d) The Requesting Jurisdiction must be operating under a state or local declaration of disaster emergency as provided for in applicable state statutes.

DEPUTY CITY MANAGER'S REPORT ON OPERATIONS

January 26, 2022

Water Treatment Plant Status:

The latest update (as of November 17, 2022) is that KDHE has completed their review of the loan application. They requested no additional information and confirmed that the final step is now under way which is the financial review which is being conducted by a contracted third party (which is their normal procedure). They also confirmed that upon completion of the project, the City of Osawatomie will receive \$1,000,000 in loan forgiveness prior to the temporary state revolving loan fund rolls over into permanent financing through USDA Rural Development. As of now, both projects are 50% designed.

You'll remember back in February of 2022; we submitted an application to the State of Kansas for a BASE Grant which would have provided 75% of our preliminary and final design costs on the new water treatment plant and distribution. Round #2 of the BASE Grant has just opened up. Unsuccessful applicants from Round #1 are permitted to revise their applications and resubmit, which we have done. We will also be submitting an application for assistance on extending water and sewer infrastructure to the Northland.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Status:

We have received our fourth invoice from Crossland Construction. The State of Kansas (KDHE), Terry, myself and our engineers have reviewed the invoice and are in acceptance of their charges. Also included in this pay application are the costs associated with parts of Change Order #2 (approved at the December 8 council meeting) regarding the old clarifier wall demolition to accommodate the expansion of the UV Structure as well as the 12" overflow line from the existing pre-sedimentation basin. Lastly, we will need to request from KDHE, an extension of the compliance deadline in the consent decree for the treatment plant. Material supply issues continue to be a struggle and deliveries of critical components are not going to occur until after the expiration of the existing compliance date of February 28, 2023. We have been in contact with KDHE and they are aware of the issues surrounding the supply chain and the impact it is having on our completion of this project. Additionally, we need to request an extension from CDBG as well. This request and related resolution are on the agenda for the February 9 council meeting.

Our ongoing battle with inflow and infiltration (I&I) continues to be an issue. BG Consultants issued an RFP for CCVT companies to bid to in order to identify sewer lines in the city that have not been part of the previous sewer main rehabilitation phases 1, 2 or 3. Unfortunately, we only received one bid, but they are the most reputable firm that provides this kind of service. Their price was \$110,250. This covers approximately 60,000 LF (<11 miles) of sewer mains. Once the Sewer Rate study is complete, we will be in a better position to make a recommendation as to what the best path forward is to address the balance of the collections system.

Evergy Solar Array Development:

At this point, the only remaining item to address is the land lease with Evergy. **Additionally, the solar panels are scheduled to be ordered within the next two weeks. Due to the Inflation Reduction Act, additional monies have been made accessible so Evergy is ordering the most technologically panels available on the market and the footprint of the array on the selected site can be reduced.**

Levee Certification / Flood Insurance Rate Map Revisions – Status Update:

The Consultation Coordination Officer (CCO) Meeting is scheduled for **JANUARY 24TH AT 1:00 PM, at Memorial Hall**. They are typically held about one month following the preliminary issuance of the flood insurance rate maps. This meeting will be a hybrid Zoom/in-person meeting. The CCO meeting is an administrative meeting with community officials to familiarize you with the due process phase of the project that will lead us up to the new map becoming official. In that meeting, we will discuss the upcoming 90-day appeal period and how it works, public notification, what the Letter of Final Determination (LFD) is, the 6-month adoption period for updating your floodplain ordinances with the new mapping, and the general schedule and timeframe of the remaining steps. It will still take approximately 18-24 months from the preliminary date for the maps to become effective. As we receive more details, I will pass them on to the City Council as we move towards the maps being finalized.

Design on 6th Street from Kelly Ave. to Lincoln Ave. as well as Brown Ave. from 7th to 12th continues. Brown Ave. is ready to go to bid. Survey work on 6th Street is nearly complete with just a few items to get tied in to the survey data. BG Consultants will be here on December 28th for a preliminary design conference on the street as well as the water lines for Brown Ave. and 6th Street as these need to get permitted through the State of Kansas prior to being installed, and they need to be installed at the same time as the existing streets are getting removed. This meeting will also cover bike lanes, pedestrian accommodations, street width, lighting, etc.
