### PUBLIC HEARINGS.

USDA RURAL DEVELOPMENT COMMUNITY FACILITIES GRANT/LOAN APPLICATION – The City of Osawatomie has filed a pre-application with the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Rural Development for financial assistance to acquire 800 megahertz (MHz) radios. These radios will allow all of our public safety departments of the City of Osawatomie to communicate with each other, as well as, the other agencies in the County that are already on the 800 MHz radio system. Mayor Mark L. Govea opened the public hearing at 6:36 p.m. for discussion and objections related to the 800 MHz radio system and application to the USDA Rural Development Facilities Grant/Loan Application. Govea asked for comments from the public three times. Hearing no further comments Govea closed the public hearing at 6:37 p.m.

The goal is to establish the framework for the fuel adjustment for the period of the weather event in February without passing on a huge price spike. **Motion** made by LaDuex, seconded by Dickinson to approve Resolution 851 – Establishing a framework for the fuel adjustment on customer electric bills caused by the weather event of mid – February as presented. This application must be submitted by March 15, 2021. **Motion** made by Macek, seconded by LaDuex to approve Resolution 852 – Authorizing the City of Osawatomie, Kansas to apply for the City Utility Low-Interest Loan Program for the purpose of obtaining a loan from the State of Kansas to finance extraordinary electric costs incurred during the extreme winter weather event of February 2021 as presented. Yeas: All.

ORDINANCE 3794 – AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF A LOAN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE CITY OF OSAWATOMIE, KANSAS AND THE STATE OF KANSAS, ACTING BY AND THROUGH THE KANSAS STATE TREASURER, FOR THE PURPOSE OF OBTAINING A LOAN PURSUANT TO THE CITY UTILITY LOW-INTEREST LOAN PROGRAM TO FINANCE EXTRAORDINARY ELECTRIC AND/OR NATURAL GAS COSTS INCURRED DURING THE EXTREME WINTER WEATHER EVENT OF FEBRUARY 2021; ESTABLISHING A DEDICATED SOURCE OF REVENUE FOR REPAYMENT OF SUCH LOAN; AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING CEERTAIN DOCUMENTS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN OTHER ACTIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE LOAN AGREEMENT —Proceeds from the loan will first be applied to the No Funds Warrants that was issued. **Motion** made by LaDuex, seconded by Dickinson to approve Ordinance 3794 — Authorizing the execution of a loan agreement between the City of Osawatomie, Kansas and the State of Kansas, acting by and through the Kansas State Treasurer for the purpose of obtaining a loan pursuant to the City Utility Low-Interest Loan Program to finance extraordinary electric costs incurred during the extreme winter weather event

of February 2021; establishing a dedicated source of revenue for repayment of such loan; authorizing certain other actions in connection with the loan agreement as presented. Yeas: All.

RESOLUTION 853 –UPGRADING TO 800 MHZ RADIOS FOR POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENTS– Miami County began upgrading all public safety radios in 2019. The total system cost was estimated at \$6.8 million. The portion attributable to the City of Osawatomie is \$83,367.75. **Motion** made by Caldwell, seconded by LaDuex to approve Resolution 853 – Directing the City Manager to complete the upgrading of the public safety radio system to 800 mhz and identifying the funding to be used to pay for the radio system upgrade as presented. Yeas: All.

RESOLUTION 854 – AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE CONTRACT AND OTHER DOCUMETATION FOR A CDBG GRANT RELATED TO THE REPAIR OF THE WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT. **Motion** made by LaDuex, seconded by Caldwell to approve Resolution 854 – Authorizing the execution of the contract and other documentation for a CDBG grant related to the repair of the wastewater treatment plant as presented. Yeas: All.

RESOLUTION 855 – LICENSING AGREEMENT WITH OSWATOMIE STATE HOSPITAL - Working with the Osawatomie State Hospital the City would like to develop a Mountain Trail Bike course on the southwestern edges of the OSH Campus. Exhibit A shows the proposed outline of the course and Exhibit B shows some of the proposed course elements. **Motion** made by LaDuex, seconded by Walmann to approve Resolution 855 – Directing the city manager to work with the Osawatomie State Hospital on a licensing agreement for an outdoor mountain bike course to be located on Hospital property. Yeas: All. Dickinson abstained due to conflict of interest.

## **COUNCIL REPORTS.**

Jeff Walmann ~ Triangle Builders is getting ready to pour the foundation for the kiosk at the trail. Doug Walker has cleared out the ditch between the ballpark and the parking lot. It is possible that the bridge could be in by April 1<sup>st</sup>. The taskforce is working on a monument sign that will look like a miniature kiosk.

Karen LaDuex  $\sim$  Morgan Crabtree has been appointed as library director. She has assumed her duty's part time for now until she gets finished with school. She will then move to full-time. The Chamber is holding a coffee at the library on Thursday at 11:00.

Kenny Diehm ~ Last November a young family moved in across the street. Last week their five-year-old daughter went out to explore. She did not tell anyone that she was going anywhere. The police were called and within minutes the police, city employees and community members were out looking for the little girl. The sheriff's department was also dispatched. Diehm would like to commend the police and the community for doing this. It just shows that it does take a village.

MAYOR'S REPORT – We need to thank LKM for taking the lead in trying to get us assistance with the large utility bills. Within a twenty-four hours span there was a hearing and the

city utility low interest loan bill passed both houses and was signed into law. There were several people making calls, sending texts and letters of support. Govea has never heard of anything like this happing so quickly before.

The Soap Box Derby is coming back to Osawatomie April 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>.

Janet McCrae has given us amazing support. We are looking at some Northland property development.

The water investigation committee will meet on March 25<sup>th.</sup> Thank you, council member Hampson, and Diehm for stepping up to be on the committee.

Also, a special thanks to our City Manager Mike Scanlon for being ahead of the game on the utility billing crisis.

There are 12 scholarship applications that have been submitted for the \$500 council scholarship. Council members Diehm, LaDuex and Walmann will help Govea review that applications.

CITY MANAGER & STAFF REPORTS. – Scanlon passed out an updated work calendar. The calendar will be updated quarterly. Scanlon has started doing a weekend video update and Sam Moon does a written weekend update. We are trying to create different ways for the public to get information from us.

Scanlon passed out a utility dashboard that shows the receipts and expenses along with the cash balances for the electric, water and sewer funds over the last five years. On the back is a list of things that we are working on. Terry Upshaw is in charge of all of our utilities. Upshaw gave a report and answered questions regarding the update on the electric, water and sewer utilities.





### **RESOLUTION NO. 857**

## A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF OSAWATOMIE, KANSAS TO BILL ACCORDING TO A CALCULATION FRAMEWORK PROPOSED FOR THE ELECTRIC UTILITY AND APPROVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL.

WHEREAS, the health, safety, and economic well-being of our residents is the top priority for the governing body of the City of **39TOSAWATOMIE**, Kansas (the "City"); and

WHEREAS, on February 14, 2021, pursuant to the Kansas Emergency Management Act, Chapter 48, Article 9, of the Kansas Statutes Annotated, Governor Laura Kelly proclaimed a State of Disaster Emergency, recognizing power outages and critical energy supply shortages were anticipated; and

**WHEREAS**, during February 2021, the City faced a winter weather emergency that resulted in extraordinary electric costs; and

WHERAS, annually, the City budgets \$4,100,000 to cover the costs associated with electricity needs; and

**WHEREAS,** as of this date, the City estimates it will have an obligation to pay a total of \$4,800,000 in electricity as a result of the unprecedented prices charged during the extreme winter weather conditions in February 2021; and

**WHEREAS**, this price spike currently estimated at \$700,000 could create a financial burden for Osawatomie electric customers.

## THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF 39TOSAWATOMIE, KANSAS AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The City staff has prepared a payment framework for the City Council to consider.
- 2. The framework (Exhibit A) includes the following:
  - a. A base calculation of a one-time charge, which includes a mechanism to make up for lost revenues (created by defaults) and accrued interest of 0.25% annually.
  - b. Three payment options for consideration including 12-, 24-, 36-month payment options.
  - c. Based on the presentation presented the City Council selects \_\_\_-month payment option for the City staff to implement.
- 3. This resolution shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its adoption and shall remain in effect until future action is taken by the Governing Body.
