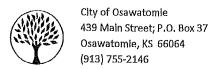

Redesigning the Layout of the Osawatomie Public Library

Overview

The current building housing the Osawatomie Public Library was built in 1980 and consists of 2 floors each measuring approximately 3600 square feet. When the original building was constructed there was little if no use for technology in libraries. Therefore, the existing electrical system is incapable if handling the current needs. In addition, as the library has transitioned from a place to store books to a community based center, the needs of the overall square footage to meet the needs of the community have also changed. Unfortunately, however, the layout of the library has not kept up with these changes. In 2008 an elevator was installed allowing for utilization of the downstairs space, which is now being used for programming space and a Friends of the Library book store. At this time all available shelf space and wall space on the main floor have been maximized and library staff are forced to dispose and materials whenever new materials are purchased. The current main floor is at capacity. In addition, because the original library was not designed with technology in mind, there are only 2 outlets on the entire floor for people to plug in, and very little seating or study space. Finally, as the use of the library space evolves so must our security needs. At this time the library has no cameras or other security in place

Proposal

The Friends of the Library have decided to discontinue their book store. We propose moving all of the children's books and part of the shelving to the lower floor creating a true Children's Department hosting materials and programming. This would free up space on the main floor for seating and study desks. We also proposal updating the existing electrical system to bring the library more in line with current community needs by providing outlets for charging computers and phones.

Creating a children's department on its own floor is not without some risk. Therefore, in addition to moving the books downstairs we propose to invest in a security system to ensure the safety of both our patrons and the libraries materials. A forward thinking option would be an expandable unit with 8-12 cameras that include recordability. These cameras would be located at the front and back doors of the building as well as in the lower level. We also would like to have an alarm placed on the fire door in the basement.

To make the library more community center based we also propose increasing seating on the upper floors as well as creating conversation and work places. If the downstairs area is going to open the patrons on a full time basis, that area will also require seating and study spaces. We would also like to increase the technology available to the kids in the lower level. This includes and additional gaming system and new computers. Our goal to be recognized as a community center for our patrons young and old.

While working on these improvements we propose to update the usable space in the north meeting room to create a true Kansas Room and research space by taking out the kitchen that was never a good use of the limited square footage, and installing shelves and a meeting table that will go along with the micro-film machine and the Digitalization Station that we recently received a grant for.

Cost

Over the past several years the Library Board has raised funds from the community with the understanding that said funds would be used for a Library Expansion (phase II). Though upgrades to both the electrical system and security systems became more necessary every day the board was uncomfortable using those funds for a renovation project rather than an expansion project as promised. In 2017 the library received a bequest in the amount of \$33,000.00 to be used as we saw fit. We propose to use to those funds to cover the costs of this renovation project to allow the library to better meet the needs of our patrons in a modern and more useful library setting. If, in the future, our plans for expansion become viable, all of the current listed improvements will fold seamlessly into the new project. We are also keeping our promise to our donors to use their money for expansion and not renovation.

Agenda Item: Discussion of Disorderly or Nuisance Residence

At Issue: There are a few residential properties within the City of Osawatomie that continually call for police assistance as it retaliates to civil disagreements, arguments and or disturbances. One such example is 500 Chestnut. Officers have been requested to respond to this address 105 times in 2017. Of the 105 calls for service about 10% involve EMS calls, another 10-15% involve welfare checks and the remainder of the calls involve some time of civil dispute or disturbance. There were 86 calls for service in 2016, and currently for 2018 the police department has received 46 calls for this same residence.

There is another residence within the City in which Officers have responded 15 times during 2018. Most of the contacts involve warrant service to individuals that frequent the home.

Staff Recommendation to the Counsel: Have Staff continue to investigate possible solutions and draft up an ordinance to address the issue. Some "Draft" examples have been included with this memo.

Current U.P.O.C.

9.5 MAINTAINING OR PERMITTING A PUBLIC NUISANCE. (a) Maintaining a public nuisance is knowingly causing or permitting a condition to exist which injures or endangers the public health, safety or welfare. (b) Permitting a public nuisance is knowingly permitting property under the control of the offender to be used to maintain a public nuisance, as defined in Subsection (a). (K.S.A. Supp. 21-6204) Maintaining or permitting a public nuisance is a Class C violation.

DRAFT - OSAWATOMIE DISORDERLY HOUSE ORDINANCE

11-340 **Disorderly Premises;** Maintaining. The term "Disorderly Premises" as used in this chapter shall be deemed to be any room, house, building, structure, or premises, where unlawful or illegal acts are being committed, or nuisances as defined in UPOC 9.5. It shall be unlawful for the owner, lessee, resident, manager, or proprietor of any room, house, building, structure, or premises to knowingly collect or permit to be collected therein persons who are engaging in any unlawful act, knowingly harbor wanted persons, habitually disturb the comfort, or decency of the immediate neighborhood, or to knowingly make, cause, permit, or suffer to be made therein any loud or improper noise to the annoyance or disturbance of any person or neighborhood. A person commits the crime of keeping a disorderly premises if he/she shall permit, allow or encourage any offense against the public peace, as defined in UPOC 9.1, to occur or continue on premises owned or controlled by him.

Inmate of Disorderly Premises. It shall be unlawful for any person to be an inmate of or visit or frequent any disorderly house as declared in Section 11-340 with knowledge of, and participation in, the illegal activities occurring therein.

Disorderly Premises; Penalty for Violations. (a) Any person who violates Section 11-340 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction of a first offense shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$150 nor more than \$500.00, and recoverable with costs (b) Any person who violates Section ----- or Section ----- or Section ----- in the ten years prior to the date of the current conviction shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for a period of not to exceed six months, or by a fine of not less than \$250.00 nor more than \$500.00, recoverable with costs, or both such fine and imprisonment. (c) Any person who violates Section ---- or Section 9.20.040 and has had two or more convictions for violation of either Section ---- or Section ----- in the five years prior to the date of the current conviction shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail for a period of three days to six months and a fine of not less than \$400.00 nor more than \$500.00, recoverable with costs.

Agenda Item: Commercial use of Utility Vehicles

At Issue: Proposal to modify the STO to allow ATVs, Micro trucks and Worksite utility vehicles to be used on City streets if they are designed or adapted to be used EXCLUSIVELY for agricultural or commercial aquaculture operations, and only when being used for those purposes.

Enforcement Problems: The enforcement of commercial use or agricultural use will be almost unenforceable, unless the operator of such vehicle commits a traffic violation. Then the Officer will be able to inquire as to the operators intentions as to the use of the vehicle.

Staff Recommendations: The Police Departments stance on this issue is to plainly mark or have the vehicle display a valid City permit or tag. Modifications to the current Standard Traffic Ordinance has been attached to the memo.

Proposal to modify the STO to allow ATVs, Micro trucks and Worksite utility vehicles to be used on City streets if they are designed or adapted to be used EXCLUSIVELY for agricultural or commercial aquaculture operations, and only when being used for those purposes.

Section 1. Definitions.

Implement of Husbandry. Every vehicle designed or adapted and used exclusively for agricultural or commercial aquaculture operations, including feedlots and live bait operations, and only incidentally moved or operated upon the highways. Such term shall include, but not be limited to:

- (a) A farm tractor;12
- (b) A self-propelled farm implement;
- (c) A fertilizer spreader, nurse tank, or truck permanently mounted with a spreader used exclusively for dispensing or spreading water, dust or liquid fertilizers or agricultural chemicals, as defined in K.S.A. 2-2202, and amendments thereto, regardless of ownership;
- (d) A truck mounted with a fertilizer spreader used or manufactured principally to spread animal dung; or
- (e) A mixer-feed truck owned and used by a feedlot, as defined by K.S.A. 47-1501, and amendments thereto, and specially designed and used exclusively for dispensing feed to livestock in such feedlot.

Sec. 114.1. Unlawful Operation of All-Terrain Vehicle.

- (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), it shall be unlawful for any person to operate an all-terrain vehicle:
- (1) On any interstate highway, federal highway or state highway; or
- (2) Within the corporate limits of any city unless authorized by such city.
- (b) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (a), (1) all-terrain vehicles owned and operated by a county noxious weed department, or all-terrain vehicles owned and operated by persons contracting with a county noxious weed department or the Kansas department of transportation may be allowed to operate such all-terrain vehicles upon the right-of-way of any federal highway or state highway for the purpose of eradicating noxious weeds and such all-terrain vehicles may be operated incidentally upon such federal highway or state highway; (2) any implement of husbandry used exclusively for such purposes on the streets and alleyways of the City of Osawatomie.
- (c) No all-terrain vehicle shall be operated on any public highway, street or road between sunset and sunrise unless equipped with lights as required by law for motorcycles. (K.S.A. Supp. 8-15,100)

Sec. 114.2. Unlawful Operation of a Micro Utility Truck.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a micro utility truck:
- (1) On any interstate highway, federal highway, or state highway; or
- (2) On any public highway or street within the corporate limits of any city unless authorized by such city.
- (b) No micro utility truck shall be operated on any public highway or street, unless: (1) such truck complies with the equipment requirements under Article 17 of Chapter 8 of the Kansas Statutes Annotated and amendments thereto; or (2) it is an implement of husbandry used exclusively for such purposes and operating on the streets and alleyways of the City of Osawatomie.
- (c) The provisions of subsection (a), shall not prohibit a micro utility truck from crossing a federal or state highway. (K.S.A. Supp. 8-15,106)

Sec. 114.5. Unlawful Operation of a Work-Site Utility Vehicle.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a work-site utility vehicle:
- (1) On any interstate highway, federal highway, or state highway; or
- (2) Within the corporate limits of any city unless authorized by such city.
- (b) No work-site utility vehicle shall be operated on any public highway, street, or road between sunset and sunrise unless equipped with lights as required by law for motorcycles. (K.S.A. Supp. 8-15,109)
- (c) The provisions of subsection (a), shall not prohibit a work-site utility used an implement of husbandry used exclusively for such purposes from operating on the streets and alleyways of the City of Osawatomie.
