## STAFF AGENDA MEMORANDUM

DATE OF MEETING: October 24, 2019

AGENDA ITEM: JTC Oil Lease

**PRESENTER:** Richard Wetzler, City Attorney

**ISSUE SUMMARY:** On November 8, 2012, the City approved an agreement with JTC Oil to lease the former ETI building. The original lease was for 3 years, with a purchase option after 3 years. The Department of Commerce had to agree to the lease since the building was purchased using Department of Commerce funds.

The agreement was renewed in 2015, 2016, 2017 and 2018 for one-year increments. Both parties have continued by the original terms of the agreement from 2012. These terms were:

- 1. JTC would pay \$1,000 per month rent (which will pass through to the state).
- 2. JTC would be responsible for the payment of the taxes on the building (currently the taxes are past due for 2016, 2017 and 2018).
- 3. JTC would be responsible for utilities and routine maintenance of the property.
- 4. Osawatomie would be responsible for continuing to insure the property.
- 5. After 3 years, JTC could purchase the building for \$150,000, but all rent payments could be applied to the purchase price when they decide to purchase it.

At this time, JTC Oil would like to execute the option to purchase this property. They plan to pay the back due taxes under protest prior to purchase of the property. The current balance due to the Kansas Department of Commerce is \$66,400.

**COUNCIL ACTION NEEDED**: Review and discuss.

**STAFF RECOMMENDATION TO COUNCIL:** Staff recommends that the Council approves the Mayor to sign a conveyance of property after compliance of tax obligations have been met and approved by the City Attorney and City Manager.
