Members of City Council and the Osawatometie Arts Commission officially cut the ribbon on a new mural by Springfield artist Lynnsey Fletcher on Thursday afternoon. The project is part of an award the City received from the Allen W. and Gladys Hawkins Charitable Foundation in 2022. The Arts Commission debuted the dual "wing wall" mural opportunities for Spring 2023 and ultimately awarded two artists to install custom artworks to greet people coming into the community.

Lynnsey's warm and colorful "Bee the Good" design is displayed near the Creamery Bridge at the 8th Street levee wing walls.

Billy Peters of Kansas City will be installing his own design on the 6th Street wing walls in the coming weeks.

CITY WIDE CLEANUP

Spring cleaning is in full force across town and Waste Management is gearing up for the first city wide cleanup day of 2023! Saturday, May 13th, 2023 will be a self-service drop off event available to all residents. Large dumpsters will be stationed in the parking lot north of the O-Zone Family Aquatic Park from 8:00am to 4:00pm that Saturday and residents are encouraged to drop off any large, irregular, or bulky items during that time. CITY COUNCIL MEETINGS



NEW VEHICLES FOR POLICE DEPARTMENT

In response to rising maintenance and fuel costs incurred by an aging fleet, the City of Osawatomie entered into a partnership with Enterprise Fleet Management Systems to lease new vehicles into the City's fleet. This lease program ensures we have continued access to safe, reliable vehicles and is estimated to reduce maintenance costs by 64% and save over 20% on fuel costs over the next five years. The Police Department is celebrating the arrival of six 2023 Chevy Traverses and will also soon be welcoming the addition of six 2023 Ford F-150 patrol-ready trucks. Other vehicles for Public Works and Utility Departments are scheduled for delivery in 2023 and 2024.

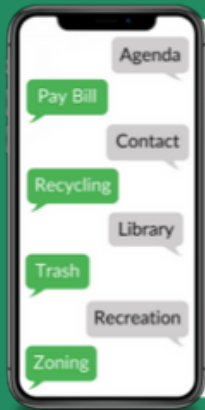
