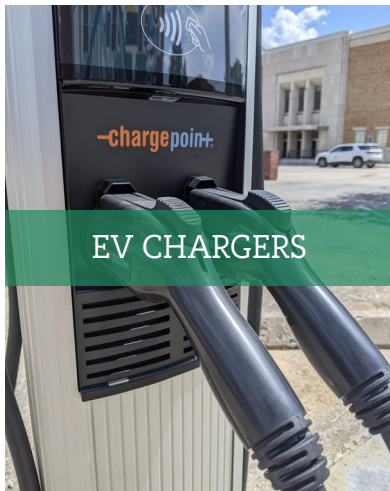




## COMMUNITY HIGHLIGHTS



### EV CHARGERS

Dual-side EV charging stations are popping up across the community as crews begin to break ground on Osawatomie: Charging Forward, our Dept. of Energy grant project. The City was part of an eight entity consortium that was awarded \$5.2 million toward EV initiatives and developments in rural communities. Stations are operated by ChargePoint, the world's largest EV charger operating platform.

Main Street between 7th and 12th Streets remains closed as crews continue work on storm sewer projects. The massive improvements to Brown Ave have required upgrades to Main Street's storm water facilities in order to handle increased water volume. Main Street from 12th to the east side of the 9th Street intersection will be reopened on Monday August 28th following the completed upgrade across 10th Street

# NEWS AND REMINDERS

## 2024 BUDGET APPROVED

At its regular Thursday meeting, the City of Osawatometie City Council reviewed and voted to approve the proposed 2024 budget after a comprehensive presentation by City Manager Bret Glendening. In front of a crowd of almost a dozen interested residents, Glendening explained the ways Osawatometie has worked to reduce strain on the overall budget (such as contracting services like mowing or eliminating positions where possible) and where money is being more efficiently directed (such as reducing transfers from utility funds). Though the City approved a budget that exceeds the Revenue Neutral Rate, the overall City mill rate is decreased for 2024.

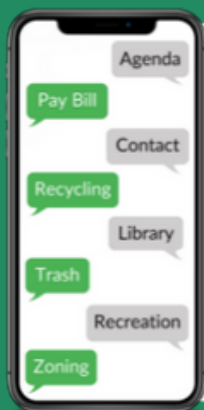
