As part of its regular maintenance program, the City is conducting a free chlorine burnout of its water distribution system beginning August 7th, 2023 and continuing for 10-14 days as needed.

Please have yard waste neatly piled curbside by 8am for pickup. Limbs should be cut to 8ft or shorter. Crews will not enter private property to collect fallen limbs.

The Forestry Disposal Site is also available for drop-off.



<u>TEMP MAIN ST DETOUR</u>

Wondering why Main Street is closed right now?

The current closure of Main Street between 7th and 12th is expected to last two to three weeks, weather permitting, and essential to connect the new storm sewer for Brown Avenue into the existing storm sewer on Main Street. During this work, the affected area will be completely closed to all traffic. Since this is part of the Brown Avenue project, Brown Avenue from 7th Street to 12th Street will also be closed to through traffic at the same time.

We ask that you do not travel around or move any of the barricades. Barricades on 7th Street and 12th Street will be adjusted to allow use of those streets without going around barricades. Detour routes are posted, with the main detour route being Pacific Avenue.
