NEWS AND REMINDERS

<u>**"THE HUB" FINAL REPORT</u></u></u>**

Representatives from Architect One were joined by representatives from Vireo and Shockey Consulting to present a selection of final recommendations from "Oz Commons: The Hub" at the December 14th meeting of City Council. This project was the City's second time winning a Planning Sustainable Places grant from Mid-America Regional Council and was a continuation of the first planning grant that took place in 2020-2021. Focus areas included the downtown space currently known as "Main Street Plaza," pedestrian connections, and the Asylum Bridge. Several community engagement opportunities were available throughout 2023, including two consultantled public meetings and two informal staffled listening sessions, as well as an online survey. Feedback from these events helped shape the recommendations developed by the consultant team. The nearly 100-page final report will be available to the public before the end of the year.

SWENSON SEES REZONING APPROVAL

The City of Osawatomie's Planning and Zoning Commission held a meeting on December 12th that included a public hearing regarding the proposed rezoning of 1009 Pacific Avenue (commonly known as Swenson School) from R-1 to R-3, which would allow for the property to be redeveloped into housing units. Following a presentation from City staff and the applicant (a developer), the Commission voted to approve the application and send it to the City Council for final review. City Council, councilmembers voted to uphold that decision and confirmed the approval of the application on December 14th. The Planning and Zoning Commission will continue to work with the interested developer on a proposed senior housing project over the next several months.

FOOD TRUCKS TO MOVE IN 2024

As our new downtown space (currently known as "Main Street Plaza") continues to develop, more activities will be centered in the plaza including the weekly visits by food trucks that are coordinated by City staff. Beginning in January, any trucks visiting for the "Food Truck Wednesday" program will be inside the plaza at 530 Main Street. Electric pedestals were installed for food trucks earlier this year and picnic table seating is available every day. More amenities will be installed throughout 2024.
