GLENDENING UPDATES PTW '24

As part of the agenda packet made available for the upcoming meeting of Osawatomie City Council on December 28th, City Manager Bret Glendening has provided an informational update on the next two years of Paving the Way (our comprehensive street repair plan). You can read the full packet here. Glendening notes that, due to the uncertainty that remains for 6th Street because of the project's magnitude, the City will likely not be looking to enter into a design contract in 2024 for the 2025 streets previously slated for full-depth replacement (proposed and approved 2025 streets included blocks surrounding the middle school and 1st Street from Main Street to the levee). In order to keep the program's momentum, a more likely scenario will be to estimate a cost to mill and overlay Parker from 12th Street to the city limits, the 500 block of Main Street, as well as East Main Street to the on/off ramps of US 169 Hwy.


BROWN AVENUE COMPLETED




"THE HUB" FINAL REPORT

Consultant team members presented a selection of final recommendations from "Oz Commons: The Hub" at the 12/14/2023 meeting of City Council. Focus areas included the downtown space currently known as "Main Street Plaza," pedestrian connections, and the Asylum Bridge. Several community engagement opportunities were available throughout 2023. Feedback from these events helped shape the recommendations developed, and the nearly 100-page final report will be available to the public before the end of the year.
