<u>6TH STREET CONSTRUCTION</u> STARTED FEB. 12, 2024

ICYMI: We've published a series of construction updates related to the full-depth reconstruction of 6th Street, including the first full street closure. Both lanes of traffic were closed from Kelly Avenue to the levee beginning on February 12th in order for contractors to install stormwater on both sides and make significant changes to the street design and elevation. Conditions permitting, this closure will last approximately one month and marks the official start of the "street and storm" portion of the reconstruction project.

Residents are welcome to attend our official ground breaking ceremony on Thursday, February 22nd, 2024 at 5:30pm. Join us at the intersection of 6th and Kelly to celebrate this critical community improvement!


LIBRARY CELEBRATES NEW GRANT ANNOUNCEMENT
