

"Chautauqua was a cultural and social movement that started in upstate New York in the 1870s and flourished until the mid 1920s. During this time, hundreds of touring chautauquas presented lectures, dance, music, drama, and other forms of "cultural enrichment". Teddy Roosevelt once called the traveling Chautauquas 'the most American thing in America.' PAVING THE WAY NEWS

Killough Construction has started work on the planned reconstruction of 18th Street on the west edge of Osawatomie! Please be aware of road closures in the area and SLOW DOWN when workers are present on-site. More information will be distributed to impacted residents as it becomes available. The work on 18th Street will move onto Main Street Terrace and, once those blocks are near completion, Killough will begin the planned reconstruction of Walnut Avenue from 4th Street to 6th Street including the 4th Street intersection. These full-depth reconstructions water distribution include some improvements, freshly poured 5-foot sidewalks, and new storm water drainage systems. Resident driveways will also receive new concrete approaches as part of the construction.

COLD WEATHER POLICY NOTICE

The City of Osawatomie has designated April 5th, 2023, as the shut-off day for customers with delinquent February bills in accordance with the Cold Weather Policy. Customers who have not paid their February 2023 utility bill will be included on the shut-off list. Bills were mailed on February 28, 2023, with a due date of March 15, 2023. Overdue accounts were given an automatic extension until April 4, 2023. If February bills are not paid by April 4, 2023, a \$27.44 delinquent fee will be assessed to the account and the account will be considered past due.
