Osawatomi is gearing up for another exciting round of transportation and downtown development planning with a second grant through Mid-America Regional Council's Planning Sustainable Places planning program. This second phase builds off the success of the first round of planning and engagement (from 2021), known as "OzCommons." This "Part II" process will narrow focus to physical connections through the entire community and will explore a community hub proposed for the downtown corridor. ROAD REPAIR UPDATES

Killough Construction has issued doorknocker notices to impacted residents along 18th Street and Main Street Terrace, alerting them to upcoming construction. Equipment, barricades, and other signage will be arriving onsite ahead of the planned March 13th, 2023, construction start date. This start date is weather dependent. The work on 18th Street will move onto Main Street Terrace and, once those blocks are near completion, Killough will begin the planned reconstruction of Walnut Avenue from 4th Street to 6th Street including the 4th Street intersection. These full-depth reconstructions include some water distribution improvements, freshly poured 5-foot sidewalks, and new storm water drainage systems. Resident driveways will also receive new concrete approaches as part of the construction.


