SPECIAL EVENT REMINDERS

Believe it or not, springtime is almost here! Warmer weather, family outings, block parties and more are on the horizon and we're looking forward to another great season of special events across the community. If you're planning a special event, keep in mind that there might be a few additional hoops you'll need to jump through in order to make your event safe and successful.

For any event that requires blocking public access (like closing Main Street to vehicular traffic or blocking the gates to John Brown Memorial Park), you'll need to submit a Special Event Permit through City Hall for review and approval by City Council. Permits are due at least 60 days ahead of your event, but larger events might need at least 120 days notice to ensure public safety.
